COON RAPIDS POLICE RESERVE DAY 50TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

Whereas, the Coon Rapids Police Reserve unit was formed with seven members on November 20, 1962; and

Whereas, in the ensuing 50 years, scores of volunteer Police Reserve Officers have provided many hours of voluntary support to the police function in Coon Rapids; and

Whereas, the Reserves have made possible a high level of law enforcement service at school events, carnivals, graduations, parades, Snowflake Days, and other community events, volunteering thousands of hours each year often on the coldest days of winter and the hottest days of summer; and

Whereas, the Reserves have also been involved in many heroic and life saving situations, both in Coon Rapids and in neighboring communities; and
