INTRODUCTION

For the past several months, the City Council has been discussing the future of The Element Teen Center at Riverwind. After discussions with staff, Council determined that the Teen Center would remain open through December 20, 2013. Staff also met with School District officials to discuss the future of the Teen Center.

DISCUSSION

On September 21, 2013, staff met with School District officials. Included in the meeting was Steve Kerr, Community Education Director; Sandra Bengtson, Community Services Program Supervisor; Sharon Legg; Ryan Gunderson; Tim Himmer; and Steve Gatlin.

The first item discussed at the meeting was use of funds provided by the City of Coon Rapids to Community Education. For some time, Council has asked for a breakdown of specific funding for various programs. That information was provided by School District officials and is summarized as follows:

Total budgeted expenditure for 2013 is approximately \$112,500 and is broken down as follows:

Youth Programs in Elementary and Middle Schools	\$78,000
Teen Programs	\$16,000
Summer Programs	\$18,500

These programs are held in all seven Coon Rapids elementary schools and Northdale and Coon Rapids Middle Schools. Youth programs involve programs for elementary and middle school students and are conducted throughout the year. Teen programs include teen nights and other activities such as open gym, plays, movie nights, hikes, and various types of after school enrichment classes.

City Council has previously asked for specific demographic data for exact participation in programs. School District officials at the meeting noted that they do not have exact demographic data for participation in various programs. They did note that there is almost an exact correlation between school demographic data by city and program participation by city. For example, if the student population of an elementary school is 95% Coon Rapids students, the program participation is 95% Coon Rapids students. Community Education staff will provide student demographic data by school at a later date. The information will be forwarded to City Council when we receive it.

Council has also expressed concerns that other cities may have reduced funding for Community Education but still receive levels of program services similar to Coon Rapids students. That issue was discussed in detail with School District officials. Steve Kerr noted that the School District does provide a base level of funding at all elementary schools with School District dollars. When cities such as Coon Rapids add additional funding, the School District

will add to the base level of programs. That is, communities that have not reduced their funding receive a much higher level of programs. The only cities that have not reduced funding in the past several years are Coon Rapids and Anoka. Coon Rapids and Anoka both receive a higher level of program activity as a result of continuing our contribution. To illustrate this, the School District has provided copies of their summer school youth activity program. It should be noted that all but one or two of the activities are held in schools in either Coon Rapids or Anoka. The 2013 Summer Activities brochure is attached.

At the middle school level, all funding is provided by the School District. For teen programs, Coon Rapids and Anoka provide additional funding that is again used to enhance the teen programs for activities such as teen night. The School District noted that on an annual basis, the total cost to operate the Teen Center has been \$12,000-\$15,000 per year. Until recently, the Teen Center received some funding from the School District.

Relative to the Teen Center, several courses of action are suggested:

- Short Term Operation

It is suggested, as previously noted, that the Teen Center remain open from October 1-December 20, 2013 using funds provided by the City of Coon Rapids. School District staff would staff the operation during this time period.

- Program Review

For the next 60-90 days, the School District will explore additional programs to expand Teen Center offerings involving youth. The intent would be to involve current users of the Teen Center in determining future direction for the Teen Center. The School District is interested in providing the maximum opportunity for youth, therefore, expanded programs in locations other than Riverwind may be the most feasible alternative.

- Riverwind Building Condition

The Coon Rapids Building Department staff has begun review of the condition of Riverwind. During the next 60-90 days, we will complete an evaluation of any necessary improvements and possible changes to bring the building to current code. We will also be receiving estimates of costs to repair items that need work.

In summary, it would be the goal to have a report by the end of the year relative to the future programs for the Teen Center and necessary improvements to the Teen Center Facility at Riverwind. Alternative programs suggested by the School District would also be part of the final analysis.

RECOMMENDATION

No action is required on this item except appropriation of funding to continue the Teen Center for three months. This item will be considered as part of the regular October 1, 2013 Council agenda. Staff will continue to work on program alternatives and future funding for the Teen Center.






